

Application Information Body Integrity Inspection Program

Please read the following information before completing the **Body Integrity Inspection Program** application form. If you need any clarification, please call the Vehicle Standards & Inspections department at 204-985-0920.

Station Requirements and Responsibilities

In order to participate in the Body Integrity Inspection Program, stations must:

- Be an MPI accredited autobody and frame repair shop or an accredited specialty frame repair shop.
- Employ a full-time certified journeyman Motor Vehicle Body Repairer authorized as an inspection mechanic who meets the <u>requirements as outlined below</u>.
- Have an enclosed space of sufficient size to carry out inspections for all vehicle classes permitted to be inspected in the inspection station.
- Own and maintain normal garage equipment in safe working condition required for an accredited body shop to perform repairs on vehicle body structure and frames, including body panels.
- Have dimensional manuals or access to dimensional specifications for all vehicle classes permitted to be inspected in the inspection station.
- Provide a copy of business license and occupancy permit.
- Provide business PST, GST, and accredited MPI account numbers.
- Forward a \$200.00 cheque payable to Manitoba Public Insurance (as an application fee).

MPI requires a \$100.00 annual renewal fee for each station.

A station authorized to **inspect motorcycles** under the Light Vehicle Inspection Program (LVIP) may qualify to inspect **only motorcycles** under the Body Integrity Inspection Program.



Inspection Mechanic Requirements

A participating station's inspection mechanic must:

- Be a certified journeyman Motor Vehicle Body Repairer.
- Have 6 years related experience.
- Be I-CAR Platinum in the Steel Structural Technician (SST) role.
- Be I-CAR Platinum in the Aluminum Structural Technician (AST) role if inspecting aluminum body vehicles.

For **motorcycle only** stations, the inspector must be authorized to inspect motorcycles in the Private Vehicle Inspection Program.

Upon Receipt of Application

When Manitoba Public Insurance receives your application, a Vehicle Standards Officer will contact you by telephone and make arrangements to inspect your facility. The Vehicle Standards Officer will also verify the information on your application, discuss the program, and answer any questions you may have.

If you meet all requirements, a training seminar will follow. The seminar includes

- A full day of instruction for the inspection mechanic.
- Approximately two hours of administrative requirements training.

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
