



Frame Replacement on Salvage Vehicles

Definitions

“Salvageable Status” – Vehicles with a salvageable status that have collision damage, structural damage or both. These vehicles can be repaired and returned to the road once they pass a Body Integrity Inspection (BIIC) and a Mechanical Certificate of Inspection (COI).

“New Frame” – A new frame is considered a part from the OEM manufacturer that has never been used or tied to any other VIN.

Replacement

When a rebuilder chooses to replace a damaged frame with a “New Frame” on a salvageable vehicle, that vehicle can be registered with the original VIN and will not require an assigned MBPGSIN. It is incumbent that the rebuilder/BIIC station ensures the invoice for the new frame is kept with the Body Integrity Inspection certificate (BIIC) file for 5 years.
