

Background

An RV is a mobile vehicle with living quarters that's used for camping or other recreational activities and is typically equipped with one or more beds and one or more of the following: stove/fridge/sink/toilet. RVs can be motorized or towed by another vehicle, for example, motorhomes, travel trailers, truck campers, fifth-wheel trailers, popup campers, and other similar vehicles.

The criteria are provided as a general guideline for determining whether a vehicle qualifies as an RV. There are exceptions to the guidelines, which Estimators and/or Adjusters will address on a case-by-case basis.

Rules

- 1. All RV claims will be created using the Light Vehicle labour rate profile. Recognized RV shops are permitted to change to the Specialty profile to access the RV labour rate in the following situations:
 - The claim does not include light vehicle damage (see example)
 - Non-remediation claims

For remediation claims or claims that include light vehicle damage, the RV shop will leave the Light Vehicle labour rate profile on but is permitted to manually calculate and markup the labour lines for RV repair operations (see the procedure in Labour Rates – RV, ORV, & Motorcycles).

- 2. RV shops may request commercial repair rates for repairs that require sublet to a commercial repair facility, such as oversized vehicle refinishing in a commercial paint booth, or frame repairs on a commercial frame machine. To be considered, shops must:
 - Add the **Commercial Repair Sublet** My Template line as a total dollar amount, which includes all applicable repair operations.
 - Provide a supporting invoice that includes a detailed breakdown of the labor hours and labor rate.

Sublet requests must be made in accordance with the <u>Sublet Repairs</u> estimating standard Requested labour rates must not exceed the current published <u>Commercial Labour Rates</u>.

- 3. For **repairable** laminated panels, the required labour and associated refinish time must be added to the estimate.
 - For **irreparable** laminated panels, MPI estimators will add the panel as a \$1.00 item. Repair shops must confirm the price of the panel and associated costs and obtain MPI approval prior to repairs.
- 4. R&I of all roof vents, air conditioning units, skylights & antennas are an included operation. Shops may request 1.0 hours for the R&I of a satellite antenna.

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5. Additional material allowances may be applied as follows:

Examples

Commercial Eligibility

A recognized RV shop is writing an estimate on their customer's class A motorhome that was involved in a multi vehicle collision. The shop has determined that the front left corner panel requires repair and refinish, and the frame has taken a twist damage condition. In this situation, due to the size of the vehicle, the RV shop will need to sublet the frame repair and corner panel refinishing to a commercial repair facility. Once the shop has confirmed all damage has been identified, they obtain a quote for the commercial repairs and enter the dollar amount in the **Commercial Repair Sublet** My Template line before submitting to MPI for approval.

Light Vehicle Only

An RV shop is writing an estimate on their customer's class C motorhome that was involved in a wildlife collision. The shop has determined that the left fender, headlamp, and lower side body panel of the living quarters will require replacement. In this situation, because the fender and headlamp are considered light vehicle repairs, the RV shop is not permitted to use the Specialty Labour profile. Instead, the repair shop must add the total repair hours for the side body panel to the RV Repairs – South My Template line, calculate the labour rate difference, and then add it to the price column. Once all parts and repair operations are listed, the shop can submit the estimate to MPI for approval.

Parts Autonomy Privileges

RV claims are excluded from Parts Autonomy privileges, lowest cost part selections are required. All requests are subject to audit and part selection reviews.

Best Practices

If you are unsure whether a repair operation or part qualifies as light vehicle, RV, or commercial, you can contact Commercial Estimating or Accredited Repair for assistance.

Procedure

Light Vehicle to RV Labour Markup


Refer to the procedure in the <u>Labour Rates – RV, ORV, & Motorcycles</u> to apply the RV labour rate markup.

Commercial Sublet Entry

Follow this procedure to apply a Commercial Repair Sublet to the estimate.

Begin with the estimate open in Mitchell Cloud Estimating.

- 1. Select the **RV Labour Rates** folder from **My Templates**.
- 2. Select the Commercial Repair Sublet line item and click Add Line.




3. From the **Estimate** tab, locate the applicable line item and enter the total sublet repair cost in the **Price** column.

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4. Click **Done**.
