

## **Program & Accreditation Consultation Committee Minutes August 19, 2025**

#### Previous Minutes (May 28, 2024):

#### **Action Items:**

- 1. Dedicated meetings were held in July to discuss feedback to recent surveys and to identify and prioritize corrective actions.
- 2. MPI published a Dealer and Repairer Plates Information Sheet
- 3. ATA is still working on market research for the fixed compensation items discussed at the last meeting.

#### **MPI Updates**

- Salvage vehicles for Red River College (RRC) Polytech collision program
  - MPI continues to support RRC Polytech and many other educational programs through donations of salvage vehicles for training purposes.
  - A combination of increasing demand and low inventory on MPI's side is impacting bulk donations.
  - MPI's Salvage team continues to work directly with impacted stakeholders.

- Surplus equipment from MPI Research Centre for RRC Polytech.
  - MPI met with representatives from RRC Polytech to explore possible donations of tooling and equipment in support of RRC Polytech's collision programs.
- Theft Update
  - MPI shared a high-level progress update on the alternative process it is exploring.
  - A committee meeting will be held in the coming weeks to incorporate feedback regarding further enhancements.
- Audit Thresholds
  - During the discussions around survey feedback, the associations asked MPI to consider raising its minimum audit recovery threshold from \$10 to \$100.
  - o MPI has explored the feasibility of this request and will pilot a \$100 minimum audit recovery threshold for six months to collect additional data.
  - Additional information will be communicated directly to impacted repair shops via a Notice to the Trade (NTT).

#### **MNP**

- Representatives from MNP attended in person and presented information about previous industry studies they had performed.
- The committee discussed options for the scope of a 2025/2026 study.
- Given timeline and cost constraints, options are being explored for a reducedscope study that still returns statistically significant results the industry will find valuable.
- Active participation by repair shops will be critical to making this study representative and meaningful towards informing the 2027 Light Vehicle Accreditation Application (LVAA) compensation schedule.

#### Glass Repair First

- MPI shared a progress update of the **Glass Repair First** initiative and responded to feedback shared by the trade.
- MPI responded to concerns from repair shops about delays, red tape, and confusion around repair eligibility, particularly regarding chip size and cracks.
- MPI clarified that many repair and replace decisions can be confidently triaged remotely using customer-provided photos or guided questions, eliminating the need for in-person inspections.
- To support consistent decision-making, MPI introduced a windshield damage evaluator tool as suggested by the trade.
- A pilot phase involving committee shops will begin on August 25th, testing both pre-approval and post-audit workflows as shops start to upload photos for all glass claims.
  - Pre-approval offers clarity and avoids disputes prior to repairs, while postaudit allows faster processing but carries recovery risks if documentation is incomplete or non-compliant.
- The initiative includes a phased rollout:
  - o Pilot testing through September
  - Broader audits in October
  - o Full implementation of the best solution by November 18.
- Enhancements to MPI's systems, such as faster uploads, simplified forms, and expanded eligibility, were spoken to as examples of reduced admin effort on glass claims to prepare for image requirements.
- Monthly performance reports and updated standards will guide shops toward compliance and continuous improvement.
- The overarching goal is to ensure that:
  - o Repairs are prioritized
  - o Fraud is minimized
  - Shops and customers benefit from a more efficient claims process.
